### *In Our Members' Own Words...*

**Renee Walk, MPH**

**Product Manager, WEA Trust**

#### **Why did you join HEI?**

I learned about HEI through a business partner and fellow MPH graduate, and was immediately interested in the Initiative's mission to improve health disparities. It also seemed like a great opportunity to work with a variety of professionals across the country on a common cause, and to understand how people in different states and different professions address these complex issues.



#### **How does your work or area of interest help or may help advance health equity?**

Currently, I work for a not-for-profit insurance carrier in the State of Wisconsin. Being a not-for-profit carrier creates a great opportunity to really focus on health programs that return value to our members, rather than focusing on return to shareholders. We also only serve public sector workers (having been founded originally by the teachers' union), and in Wisconsin these are often lower-paying jobs. This means that we often have to consider socioeconomic factors when we design disease improvement. In addition, I am also a partner in a property management company, which primarily owns low-income

housing. This experience as much as anything has shown me that non-health professions can have a significant effect on health outcomes, and stakeholders in these areas should be included as much as possible when proposing policies to reduce health disparities.

Currently, my research specifically focuses on the social impact of technology on health literacy; particularly, the connection between online health messages using social media/social network site and offline health behaviors. In addition to my day job - I am one of three co-hosts for the weekly Health Communication, Health Literacy & Social Science (#hchlitts) Tweet Chat (<http://hchlitts.net>) since November 2011. The Thursday night tweet chat focuses on a range of topics and guests related to health disparities/health equity, social justice, and our social world.


